Pack those boxes...It's Moving Time!



like the swing set, keep popping up. I think I might bring one of the swings with us and try to hang it from something in the Philippines. Hopefully that will give the kids a sense of familiarity and home. Every time I become aware of something that we have to give up, I am continually reminded that Jesus is SO worth it! The apostle Paul wrote in Philip. 3:7-8 "But whatever was to my profit I now consider loss for the sake of Christ. What is more, I consider everything a loss compared to the surpassing greatness of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them rubbish, that I may gain Christ."

What will our First Year on the Field look like?

Some of you may be wondering what we will be doing once we get there. Our long term vision is to launch a church planting movement by establishing a Training Center for church planting which will then send out church planters. That being said, a venture like that doesn't happen over night. The Evangelical Free Church has some required training for us before they will let us loose on our own. The focus of our first year will be on learning to speak Tagalog (A Filipino language). Year two will take us to the next step in our training process. During this time will be doing part-time Tagalog study and a part- time internship on a church planting team in Metro Manila. After two years we will move to southern Luzon and start church planting on our own. Once we have planted our first church, our desire is to begin the training and sending center where we will begin to train nationals to plant churches. In the meantime, our first weeks in Manila will be busy trying to find a home to live in, getting our kids started in school (the semester begins August 3rd), buying a used car or van to get the kids to school in, and hosting our short term mission team from Shepherd's Community Church.
